

Ross Large is a brilliant and passionate earth scientist who has led his team at UTAS in making a ground breaking discovery relating to the rises and falls of life on planet earth over hundreds of millions of years which puts human life in perspective as we appeared on the scene only in the last two million years. His presentation was warmly received by our members

#### Guest Speaker this month

Jeff Leis is an Adjunct Professor at the Centre for Ecology and Biodiversity at IMAS. He works on the early-life history of marine fishes, in particular, the larval stages of demersal, coastal species. His research focuses on the identity and ontogeny of fish larvae, on the relationships of fishes, on the behaviour and sensory abilities of fish larvae, on the dispersal of marine fish larvae, and on the connectivity of populations of marine demersal fishes.

Jeff Leis takes us into the fascinating world of fish larvae and the 'Big Blue' environment they occupy. Marine bony fishes, as opposed to sharks and rays, nearly all spawn tiny eggs that hatch into larvae that are not only tiny themselves, but bear little, if any resemblance to their parents. These tiny larvae drift away from their spawning site, and, without any parental care or instruction, manage to grow and survive in the seemingly featureless blue of the open ocean. Somehow, after a few weeks to months, they must find 'home', leave the pelagic environment, survive a 'wall of mouths' waiting for a tiny, tasty fish meal, and metamorphose from their fantastic larval form into something resembling their adult. Completing the life cycle of a marine fish is no simple matter with changing body forms, foods and environments. For over 40 years, Jeff has been studying these larvae and how they make their way in the ocean and will tells us just how Nemo and his tiny larval mates manage to do the seemingly impossible.
