This Month Guest Speaker

Peter Cripps Architect and Heritage consultant

Peter Cripps has had a long interest in and involvement as an architect looking after Tasmania's historic buildings and sites. For many years he was a consultant to the National Parks and Wildlife service and involved with the Port Arthur historic site, he has been a member of the Tasmanian heritage council and is a member of the Resource Management and Appeals Tribunal. He is a life fellow of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects and a life member of the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings.

In recent years Peter has been to the UK and Europe a number of times during which he has visited many of those historic places which are featured in the development of our European heritage.

Today Peter will speak about three significant places in France: the Palace of Versailles, Chateau Malmaison and Foundation Louis Vuitton. He will talk about the circumstances of their development, their inter-relationships and, believe it or not, their associations with Australia and Tasmania in particular.


Luncheon News (Geoff Medhurst 6225 4333)


