THE REMARKABLE CAPTAIN JAMES KELLY OF VAN DIEMEN'S LAND

Presenter: Tony Hope - Tasmanian Historian Extraordinaire



The members are fortunate to experience another presentation from outstanding Tasmanian, historian, author and club member Tony Hope.

James Kelly, the son of an Irish convict woman, was born in Parramatta in 1791 and at the age of thirteen, was apprenticed to Cable and Underwood for five years to learn to be a master mariner. He became Australia's first master mariner and later moved to Hobart in 1814.

The story of James Kelly is better than fiction!

After his epic circumnavigation of Van Diemen's Land in 1815/16 in a five oared whaling boat, during which time he named Port Davey, Macquarie Harbour and Sarah Island, encountered different bands of Tasmanian Aborigines and was mistaken for a bushranger.

You will hear more of this epic tale when Tony recounts significant Tasmanian historical events from his recently published book covering the exploits of Captain James Kelly.
