


PRESIDENT'S THEME FOR THE YEAR

We generally refer to it as the Orphan Schools, New Town. Some of our members may know it as St John's Park Hospital.

The Orphan School and St John's Park Precinct situated in St. John's Avenue, New Town, Tasmania is a heritage site of local, state and national significance. The Orphan School buildings, constructed between 1831 and 1833, and St John's Church, built in 1834 form the nucleus of the Precinct.


