Having been interested in ships and the Port of Hobart from an early age, I used to accompany my father to the waterfront at weekends during the fruit season to look at the "apple boats". This led to photographing ships in the port with a Kodak Box Brownie in 1960 and I still try to obtain a photograph of every vessel that calls. Hobart is a great place for this, with plenty of vantage points, and generally an uncluttered background. The Tasman Bridge is a favourite spot, also Rosny Hill and the CSIRO complex at the outer end of Princes Wharf. A digital camera and powerful zoom lens are now the equipment of choice.

I joined the Maritime Museum in 1985, and enjoy the privilege of being a Life Member and Vice-President as well as being an active volunteer, particularly with visiting schools and tour groups. My career was with Customs for nearly 35 years - the maritime connection being the draw card.

I've recently completed a book on some of the interesting ships that have visited Hobart over two centuries. "Ships of Hobart Harbour" was commenced by my dad's cousin, the late George Cox, and published in mid 2014 by George's son-in-law.
