Ted Pritchard described how to use a 'bean bag' in lieu of a tripod for additional support and the benefit of a 'Joby GorrillaPod'. Ted also explained why he only uses the 'manual' setting (all those knobs and buttons are too much to remember) and then demonstrated just how easy it is to simply use the exposure scale. He demonstrated how, even with flash and back lighting, it's no problem getting a correct exposure.
