Guest Speaker

Our very enjoyable guest speaker for August was Simon McCulloch, Senior Forecaster at the Bureau of Meteorology and ABC weatherman.



Simon outlined his current role at the Bureau involving project management and Office Chief. He has worked on the establishment of the new Mt Koonya radar station which has given a much better view of short term weather in South East Tasmania and more recently, on advanced computer modelling for longer term forecasting. Emphasising the impact of modern computing and satellite technology, Simon described how global computer modelling could produce only one forecast for the whole of Tasmania when he commenced in 1989. Now we have 10 day forecasts for 8000 grid points around the State and a 600 metre resolution model is being developed.

A new satellite being launched in 2014, will provide satellite weather updates every 10 minutes and the ability to track dangerous short term events like thunderstorms. Simon also described his daily routine and the three hour process of bringing the weather to air on ABC each night. He fielded many questions from members in the same fluent and at times, humorous way he delivered his address. (Ted Best)
