Guest Speaker July 2014 Meeting:

Richard Bevan was introduced by Terry Bowes. Richard retired in 2010 from the position of CEO and Managing Director of Transend Network, which position he had held for twelve and a half years prior to retirement. Richard is currently a Non-executive director of Crisp Bros. & Haywards and is International Treasurer of the International Council on Large Electric Systems. Richard is a Fellow of Engineers Australia and of the Australian Institute of Company Directors. Richard is married to Moira and they have two adult children.

Richard's topic for the day was the History of Electricity Transmission in Tasmania.

The talk ranged from the earliest days of electricity transmission in Tasmania when the first transmission lines were commissioned in 1916 until the present time.

Interestingly, electricity was first generated in Tasmania for the Mt Bischoff mine on Tasmania's west coast in 1883, only one year after Thomas Edison's first central New York USA power station was commissioned. Subsequent local power generation developments occurred for the Waverley Woollen Mills in Launceston, Hobart electric trams and the Hobart Gas Company.

The Great Lake Development Scheme began in 1909, and was, as were all other schemes of the time, a privately funded enterprise. However, it ran into financial difficulties in 1914, causing the Tasmanian Government to step in with the establishment of the Hydro Electric Department. That beginning saw the

establishment of the Waddamana Power Station and the transmission of power to Hobart, approximately 100 km away. In 1916, this became the first high voltage transmission line in Australia, some eight years before the next, developed in Victoria, from the Latrobe Valley to Melbourne.

The Hydro Electric Department became the Hydro Electric Commission in 1929. This organisation became corporatised in 1995 and was dis-aggregated resulting in the birth of triplets, including Transend Networks Pty Ltd on 1 July 1998 with that new company becoming responsible for Tasmania's electricity transmission system. For a period of approximately five years, Transend also become the system controller when the Bass Link undersea cable enabled Tasmania to join the National Electricity Market.

Richard made the understanding of the complexity and scale of the underlying engineering and construction issues capable of being understood by members. Additionally, his talk clearly demonstrated his pride in being a part of the "Hydro" story and team for some thirty five years, commencing from his time as a junior cadet engineer.

A vote of thanks was moved most sincerely by John Brodribb and carried by acclimation.
