- The Risby family collection of Haughton Forrest paintings, principally of Risby family trading vessels.
- The Lamprell collection of maps 'Exploring the South Land', presenting maps from around 400 years of European explorers on voyages of discovery around Australia with early detail maps of sectors of the Tasmanian coastline.

Following on we were given a guided tour of the exhibits in the main gallery, viewing bark canoes of the style used by aborigines, photographs of early settlers trading vessels, the Port of Hobart over time, & the vessels that operated around the Port.
