Andrew & Irene Gray - Rotary Club of Salamanca Projects.

Model Town Project in Fiji: Fiji was hit by 3 cyclones in recent years, which caused housing devastation on a massive scale. The Rotary Club heard about the plight and used financial handouts to build cyclone proof shelters in the village of Koroipita. They also provided technical, financial and administrative support.

Gift of Sight Project in Nepal: The Club fund-raised \$1000 which was matched by a Rotary District grant for setting up an eye screening camp in Nepal. The camp was well promoted and 1047 people were screened in a couple of days. Some required eye drops, others required glasses, 179 required surgery for cataracts and 4 were blind and had their sight restored. The club was also very active in providing clean water, which saved the locals a 2 hour walk to a river.

Members asked a number of questions and praised the Salamanca Rotary Club for undertaking such worthwhile projects. (Editor)


Luncheon
