

September Presentation - Rev Prof Michael Tate



Rev Prof Michael Tate AO PP graduated in Law from the University of Tasmania in 1968 and in Theology from Oxford University in 1971. He lectured at the University of Tasmania from 1972-78, being Dean of the Faculty of Law in 1977-78. He was a Senator for Tasmania from 1978-93, being Federal Minister for Justice from 1987-93. He served as the Ambassador to The Hague and the Holy See from 1993-96. He then returned to Australia, was ordained in May 2000, and has been a parish priest in the Archdiocese of Hobart since then. Currently,

he is the Parish Priest of South Hobart Catholic Parish. Fr Tate was also the Vicar General of the Archdiocese for several years. He is an Honorary Professor of Law at the University of Tasmania where he lectures in International Humanitarian Law.




OCTOBER OUTING IMAS Tuesday October 17

A Fighting Spirit

President Rob Brand briefly informed us of the terrible loss of their son Marcus in 1995 and their brave road to recovery.

Rob's wife, Margaret, has written a book on their journey from grief to acceptance. Below is information regarding the book. Please see Rob if you have any enquiries.



On 22nd March 1995, Rob and Marg Brand lost their only son, Marcus, aged 22 with no known cause of death. Rob was managing TT Line at the time and was passing through Port Phillip Bay on Spirit of Tasmania that morning, so Marg and their 18-year-old daughter Sarah faced the initial ordeal alone.

Following the Port Arthur massacre a year later, Marg felt the need to record her journey, knowing how many families were experiencing what she was going through. However, after the first draft she found the emotional strain too much while having to meet and greet guests in her tourist accommodation business, so she put it away until she retired.

Marg's book has now been published in London. This emotional story is a beautifully written, insightful, page turning book that will help provide acceptance and peace of mind to those who have lost loved ones or are facing their own mortality.
