
First General Meeting for the new year

Sean Riley, Tassal's Head of Environment, explained the breadth and importance of Tassal's operations in Tasmania and across wider Australia. It's new to many of the members that they have substantial prawn and barramundi farming operations as well as their established salmon operations.

Sean detailed the growth in salmon annual production from 400 tons 30 years ago to 39,800 tonnes today. Future demand is growing strongly.


Key challenges for the future include meeting growing demand while protecting the environment. The application of new technology and moving offshore will be among the solutions.

UNDERSTANDING SKIN CANCER

Di Mason founded Melanoma Tasmania in 2014, which expanded its scope of practice to include all skin cancers in November 2019.

Topics to be covered in Di's talk include:

- The difference between melanoma and keratinocyte (or non-melanoma) skin cancers
- The cause of skin cancer
- How to identify skin cancer why we do not have a skin screening program
- How to protect your family learn from our lack of sun safe education
- Vitamin D the balance of getting adequate amounts without risk of skin damage
- Changes in treatment practices for melanoma.

This is essential information for all our members and their families. Our members were brought up at a time when there was little education on skin cancer protection. As we age, our old sun practices are coming back to haunt us. Knowledge is a key factor in protecting ourselves.

APRIL OUTING - RUNNYMEDE





Our April outing was to historic Runnymede. Runnymede is a snapshot in time of Tasmania's history in the early to mid-1800s. We toured the house, whose furnishings are originals from the period. Significant colonial Tasmanians lived in the house, including the first Anglican bishop and an early solicitor who was an advocate for Tasmania moving from a penal colony to a selfsustaining community. I enjoyed the story of the bishop having his most trusted convict prepare and provision his boat for an offshore pastoral visit. When the Bishop arrived the next morning to set sail, the boat had gone along with his no longer trusted convict and several of his mates. That wasn't the end of the story, the convicts reached America and sent back a cheeky letter thanking the bishop for providing the boat and provisions.

After our tour we retired for a relaxing lunch at the Succulent Restaurant at the Botanical Gardens.

Grateful thanks to guides Lyn and Chris for a wonderful trip back in time to Tasmania's colonial period. Your knowledge of the house and the times provided a most interesting experience. NB

Granddaughter: It was Julius Sneezer, of course.


